

Teen Leadership Programs

Over the years, Camp Dreamcatcher has expanded its programming to meet the changing needs of HIV/AIDS infected/affected youth. In 1999, Camp Dreamcatcher offered its first Counselor in Training (CIT) program and in 2008, its first Leaders in Training (LIT) program. We offer a Teen Leadership Retreat and Teen Life Skills Retreat, which include therapeutic and educational sessions on team building, college preparation and leadership training. Graduates of the Teen Leadership Retreat may become members of our Teen Speaker's Bureau and share their personal stories and challenges with middle schools, high schools, universities and community groups. Our hope is that the teens will transform their HIV/AIDS challenges into becoming positive leaders in their communities.

What began as a one-week camp session has expanded to year-round programs for children coping with the harsh reality of HIV/AIDS. The children attending our programs may be coping with their own HIV/AIDS infection, the HIV/AIDS diagnosis of a family member, or the loss of a family member to AIDS.

 To provide therapeutic and educational services for HIV/AIDS infected and/or affected youth


 To foster an atmosphere of tolerance, compassion, respect and understanding through volunteer opportunities, services and expanded community outreach

Campers, age 5-17, enjoy horseback riding, go-kart racing, swimming, arts/crafts, miniature golfing, concerts, boating, basketball, tennis, volleyball, a camp-wide carnival, cooking and our annual dance and talent show! The camp week includes separate programs for younger campers (5-11), older campers (12 & 13), teen campers (14 & 15), counselors in training, leaders in training (16) and junior counselors (17).

What makes Camp Dreamcatcher unique?

- All of the programs offered by Camp Dreamcatcher are free.
- Our programs include both therapeutic and educational components. Therapeutic modalities offered include music therapy, art therapy, movement therapy, group psychotherapy, yoga and massage.
 Age appropriate educational sessions are provided focusing on HIV/AIDS, grief, depression, addiction, body image, puberty, abuse, peer pressure, family/ community violence, conflict resolution, relationships and the healthy expression of feelings.
- Over 300 counselors, medical personnel, professionals and community members volunteer during the camp session – providing over 13,500 hours of service!
